

Transition to Residency Checklist:

Things to consider:

- ACLS – do you need it prior to starting at your new program?
- Vacation next year – think ahead
 - a. Planning a vacation in the late winter/early spring is well needed (March)
 - b. If you have special dates such as weddings, etc, let your departments know. It is easier to have these dates set aside now rather than later.

If you are moving:

- Somewhere to live (talk to other residents in your new program)
 - AMA and AMSA provide some moving assistance and resources
- Driver's license
- License plates
- Bank account
- Mail – change of address (i.e. especially on bills, etc)
- Childcare? – ask questions of people currently in the program

What will you need for your pocket?

- ACLS handbook or information card
- Pharmacopia – some type of book or program on your palm with drug information
- Sanford – a handbook or program on your palm with micro information
- Resource for Common Cross-Cover such as the laminated card here today
- Ask residents in your small groups for other ideas
